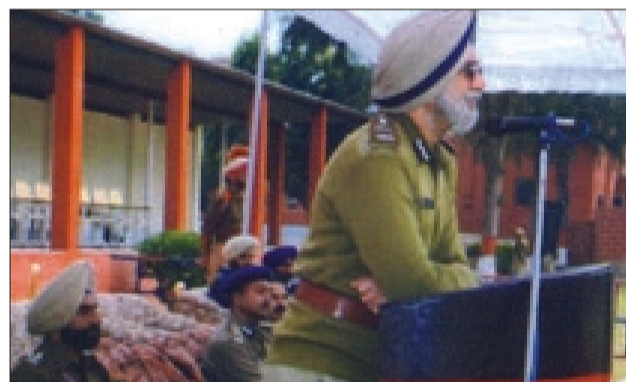

Punjab Govt. Takes Initiative to Train Private Security Professionals

PUNJAB SECURITY TRAINING INSTITUTE, JAHAN KHELAN, HOSHIARPUR

The Government of India has enacted "The Private Security Agencies (Regulation) Act, 2005". Accordingly, the Government of Punjab to comply with the provisions of Act has notified "The Private Security Agencies Rules, 2007". Punjab Govt. has also decided to establish the Punjab Security Training Institute at Jahan-Khelan, Hoshiarpur, in the premises of Police Recruits and Training Centre to train youths from the State for employment as Security Guards. The institute has imparted training to 239 youths from Punjab from Jan 21st, 2008 to 20th March, 2008. Training of second batch of 200 youths is starting from 5th May 2008. At present infrastructure of Police Training School, Jahan khelan is being utilized to impart training. State of the art infrastructure at the institute will come up during the year 2008-2009 with a minimum capacity of training of 4000 trainees per year.



training syllabus is prescribed in the Punjab Private Security Agencies Rules, 2007. It is of two months duration and covers various aspects of security requirement i.e. physical fitness, parade, unarmed combat, physical security, fire fighting, crowd control, evacuation during emergency, surveillance, identification of documents, I.E.Ds. & different types of weapons, handling & operating 12 bore gun, first-aid, knowledge of law, use of computer related electronics gadgets (including CCTV, smart cards & biometrics controlled access entry), wireless & mobile communication etc. The institute is spread in an area of 50 acres. When completed in the year 2008-09, the institute will have indoor training block with modern class rooms, modern laboratories/workshops, administrative block, outdoor training block, multimedia room, library, guest house for guest faculty, modern hostel for boys and girls etc. Auditorium, hospital, gymnasium, residences for faculty etc., will be added subsequently in coming years.

The Institute is Offering two courses :- (1) 2 months duration vocational course for security guards. (2) Certificate course for security supervisor of 6 months duration (being started shortly).

The institute is managed by Punjab Police Security Corporation constituted under the Companies Act with the approval of the Govt. of Punjab. The ex-officio Chairman of the Corporation is Director General of Police, Punjab. The institute is headed by a senior police officer with vast experience in industrial security training. The Institute also has a placement Officer whose main job is to liaise with industries & business establishments for improvements. The



Punjab Government and CAPSI to Organise ROZGAR MELAS

Punjab Government and Central Association of Private Security Industry (CAPSI) have agreed to sign a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) to organise ROZGAR MELAS in the various districts of Punjab. CAPSI is an apex body of Private Security Industry representing 15000 Private Guarding Companies operating through out the Country. There are more than 50 Lakh Private Security Guards working in India.



A joint meeting of Punjab Government and CAPSI was held on 22 April 2008 in Chandigarh in which Sh. Parkash Singh Badal Chief Minister along with Sh. Ramesh Inder Singh, Chief Secretary, Sh. D. S Guru, Principal Secretary, Sh. N.P.S Aulak DGP, Sh. M.K. Tewari, IPS, Managing Director of Punjab Police Housing Corporation participated. The CAPSI was represented by Kunwar Vikram Singh, Chairman CAPSI, Col Jagat Trikha Executive Director, CAPSI, Brig P.S Toor (Retd) Chapter Chairman Punjab, Brig P.P.S Dhillon (Retd) Vice Chairman, Col D.S Mangat, Sr Vice President and Sh. Baldev Singh Thind Secretary General of Punjab Chapter of CAPSI.

Kunwar Vikram Singh said that the Punjab Govt has already started Training Institute at Jahan Khelan, Hoshiarpur to impart 2 months training to youth, willing to join Private Security Profession. The training is being given free of cost to the selected Youngman. He further said that Sh. Parkash Singh Badal has agreed to start Certificate and Diploma Courses in Security Management, which will enable Youngman to get employment in Foreign Countries.

As per the draft MoU, more that 50 major Private Security Companies will participate in the Rozgar Melas to select people for employment. It is expected that more than 50 thousands youth will be given gainful employment through such Job Fairs.

He said that the Punjab Government has already notified the “Private Securities Agencies Regulation Act 2005” in the State under which every Private Security Guard needs to undergo a training of 21 days. As per the Act, no Private Security Agency can operate without obtaining License from the Controlling Authority, designated by the State Government.

During the joint meeting, it was also agreed to constitute joint committee of Govt of Punjab and the CAPSI to regulate the operations of Private Security Agencies and the other Security Training Institutes in Punjab.

A delegation comprising of the Chairman, Kunwar Vikram Singh, Mahesh C. Sharma, Secy Gen., Brig. Mann, Mr. B S Thind and Col. Jagat Trikha met Shri. N P S Aulakh, IPS, DGP, Punjab at his office at Chandigarh as per his invitation to apprise him about the activities of the CAPSI & APDI with special reference to assist the Govt. of Punjab for the recruitment of the youth into the Private Security Agencies through the Job Fairs and also to present him a

copy of the Report on the 2nd National Conference of the CAPSI & APDI.

Mr. Aulakh apprised all present that Punjab Police have opened a Security Training Institute at Jahan Khelan, Hoshiar Pur for the training of their youth prior to joining the Private Security Agencies as the Security Guards. Mr. M K Tewari, The MD of the Punjab Police Housing Board, responsible for the Training Institute was also present for the meeting along with the DGP, Punjab.

Kunwar Vikram Singh, The Chairman complimented the efforts of the Punjab Police for the establishment of the Punjab Police Security Institute at Jahan Khelan, Hoshiar Pur and then briefed Shri Aulakh about the Security Industry and the PSAR ACT 2005 to regulate the Private Security Industries in the Country. He also mentioned about the large Private Security Force and its utilization by the DGP for the Intelligence Gathering and for the Disaster Management role in the State of Punjab.

Hon'ble Minister also stated that Govt is also thinking for cancellation of section 23 of Maharashtra Private Security Guards Act 1981, under which agencies have been granted Exemption earlier.
