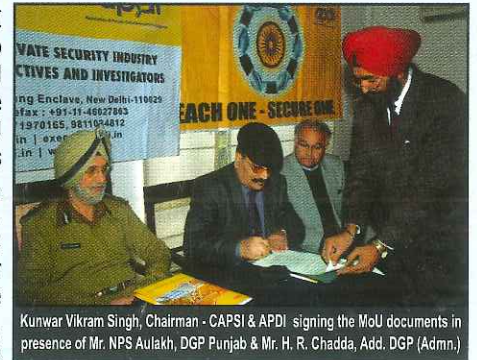
Government's notification to permit CISF to provide security cover to some of the big corporates is certainly a welcome move. This will generate secure environment for their clients. But similar services can also be provided by Private Security Industry, provided they are given permission to use effective weapons & protection gear. We have approached Ministry of Home Affairs to give due consideration to our demand for issuing arm licences to Private Guarding Companies and they will depute ONLY EX-SERVICEMEN to handle such weapons. They are trained to handle small arms and their credential and qualification are most suitable for such operations. These Protection Officers will use weapon during duty hours and deposit it in company's armoury after dis-engagement from duty. This is the need of the time, as all business houses may not be in a position to afford CISF. Now we have more challenging jobs to do for the safety of our workforce and the end user. We pay homage to all officers, jawans and guards who gave away their lives while fighting against terrorists.

POLICE COMMISSIONER, DELHI PROVIDES RELIEF ON CIT VEHICLE MOVEMENT

Delhi Chapter team comprising Secretary General Sanjeev Paul, Treasurer Ravi Kapur and Chairman Jasbir S. Wasu were led by National Chairman Kunwar Vikram Singh and Secretary General Mahesh Sharma for a meeting with the Police Commissioner Y.S. Dadwal at Police Headquarters on November 26th, 2008 for representing the difficulties being encountered by the Cash-in-Transit sector of the PSI.

Kunwar Vikram Singh extended the PSI greetings to the Commissioner and also presented an update on the 3rd National Conference of CAPSI and APDI held at Bangalore in October.

The Commissioner expressed keen interest in the Private Security Industry activities and encouraged the role being played by the industry in promoting the law enforcement efforts of the Delhi Police.

Jasbir Wasu, Chairman DC drew the Police Chief's attention to various difficulties being faced by the PSA's engaged in rendering CIT, ATM replenishment, armed security and other services to the financial sectors of the Indian economy such as Banks etc. He elaborated on issues such as existing traffic restrictions on plying of cash vans, antecedent verification process of the security personnel by the police, restrictive action against gunmen from outside Delhi, arms licensing relaxation for security personnel etc.

Commissioner Y.S. Dadwal gave a patient hearing and advised that there were many factors involved with the various issues raised ranging from administrative to legislative processes and that while he would provide relief on the traffic restrictions on the movement of the CIT vehicles the other issues would have to be dealt with piecemeal as the channels to be involved were different. The Chief was very supportive and assured the delegates that he would extend all support to the Private Security Industry in its role of protecting people and property and directed Wasu to follow up on the matters. Sanjeev Paul referred to the security arrangements at the ITPO, Pragati Maidan to which the Commissioner replied that as per the information relayed to him the arrangements were good.

National Chairman Kunwar Vikram Singh extended the industry's gratefulness and reiterated that the Delhi Police would continue to receive support from the PSI and that the PSI members would be alerted to be more watchful and report to the authorities any unlawful activities that they learn of.

CAPSI Delegation meets Secretary General PHDCCI

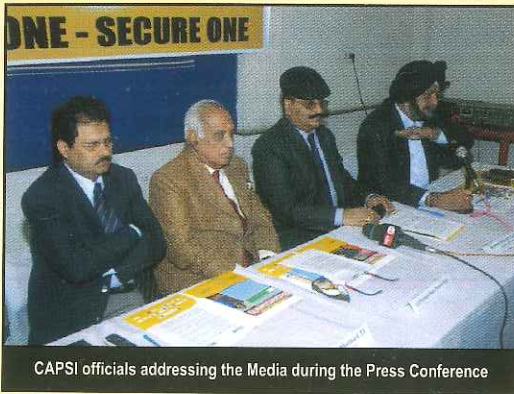

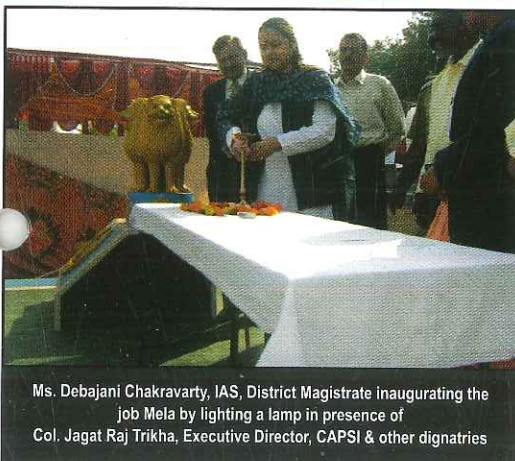

APDI Delegation meets Joint Secretary, MoH

APDI delegation consisting of Kunwar Vikram Singh, Chairman, CAPSI & APDI, Mr. Mahesh C Sharma, Secretary General, CAPSI & APDI, Mr. Subhash Wadhawan, Vice Chairman APDI and Col. Jagat Trikha, Executive Director, CAPSI & APDI met Mr. Dilip Singh Kotia, Joint Secretary, Police Modernisation, Ministry of Home Affairs at his office at 1600 hrs on the 14 November 2008 to discuss the status of the PDAR bill pending with the Government. Kunwar Vikram Singh shared in details the apprehensions on the thinking of the members of the Standing Committee for the comments on the proposed bill and highlighted the need of the early action for the placement of the draft bill in the forthcoming Winter Parliament Session during the month of December 2008. He further clarified that the Chairperson did ask for some clarifications on the size of the Detective Agencies operating in India and the list of APDI membership, as received from Col. Trikha was sent to her with the noting that there are many more Detective Agencies, who are yet not taken the APDI membership, but operating in the Country.

Mr. Kotia further said that he will keep the association apprised about the developments in the finalization of the draft PDAR bill. Kunwar Vikram Singh, while thanking Mr. Kotia for his valuable time also presented him with the folder containing the Souvenir of the 3rd National Conference, copy of the SECURITY POST for the month of October and the CD containing the photographs of the 3rd National Conference held on the 13-14 October 2008 at the hotel The Grand Ashokta, Bangalore.

CONCEPT NOTE - EOSO

A NEW CHALLENGE FOR THE PRIVATE SECURITY INDUSTRY

The date 26/11 has gone into the Most Challenging chapters of Modern Indian History. Black Cats Commandos of the NSG did a splendid job against all constraints. The COPS with the current state of affairs in the Country did more than what they could do or are designed & equipped to do. The Fire Officers & Men too did an equally fine job, particularly when they had to fight extensively to rescue the hostages from the terrorists holed up in the Hotels, than with the fires produced by the terrorist attack. The humble citizens exhibited maximum restraint and calm, watching live every moment the finest terrorists' flushing out operation in the world in the recent times, carried out in a most deliberate & restrained method by the NSG Commandos, and so meticulously & untiringly covered live by the daring journalists of the Indian TV & media.

On Nov 26, Pakistani Terrorists struck Mumbai again, this time from an unexpected sea route creating a War like situation in Southern part of Mumbai, seizing two of its most prestigious Taj and Oberoi-Tridents Hotels, Nariman House (renamed as Chhabad House in the recent past), spraying bullets at the innocent passengers at the open waiting hall of CST Railway Station of Mumbai, attacking Cama Hospital, carrying out as declared, a chance killing of ATS Chief Hemant Karkare, Additional Commissioner Ashok Kamte, and encounter specialist Inspector Vijay Salaskar.

South Mumbai was virtually under siege by the Pak Terrorists for almost 60 hours over three days, till NSG Commandos were able to finally gun down all the terrorists one by one from all the three buildings.

S R Arasa with AK-47 in a bid to escape, after the policemen punctured the tyres of a police Qualis, they were earlier using after killing ATS Chief Hemant Karkare, Sh. Ashok Kamte and Inspector Sh Vijay Salaskar.

This whole episode, if seen through different lenses again and again, wherein a meager strength of 10 young illiterate or little literate terrorists entering the Financial City of India, from the Gate Way of India, holding complete India to ransom, calls for a COMPLETE INTROSPECTION by one and all connected with the existing Security System in India, Government or Non Government, Corporate / Business Houses in all respective States & Union Territories of India.

It has thrown open a major challenge for all of us in the Security & Intelligence Services, whether in the Government or otherwise.

That is, if 10 such wrongly motivated or hypnotized ready to die terrorists, can take a major city to ransom for a considerable amount of time, causing havoc, damage & destruction worth more than 10,000 Crores of rupees in time and money, goes to substantiate that 100 such terrorists with the same modus operandi can thus take a whole country to ransom, as they will be just simultaneously located @ 10 terrorists at 10 different locations in the country, and further more, 1000 such terrorists are thus similarly sufficient to easily take the whole world to ransom.

Dangerously, there has been a mushrooming of some anti-social elements trying to form religious fundamentalist groups and parties the world over, involved in the training of hypnotized illiterate or just somewhat literate unemployed youths, motivated to die in the name of their religion. This, if not immediately encountered and contained, will be obviously devastating for the whole modern civilization.

What is the answer then?

Prepare or Perish!

Prepare whom!

Prepare Police and People en masse to remain One Up for Self Protection.

It's a syndrome for "People War People Army", which can be easily applied here too. We have to thus Prepare the whole system for this uncalled for "Terror War" on our Simple and Innocent People.

"Preparing Police" by way of imparting better training and equipment is the State responsibility.

"Preparing People" can be easily undertaken by the Private Security Agencies working already in tandem with them in their offices, premises, houses, societies etc, and this can be designed & implemented in many ways.
